Day 1. Sat 01 Oct: Home Port - Wagga Wagga

Dinner

This morning we pick you up from home and begin our trek across to South Australia. We enjoy a comfort stop for lunch before arriving into Wagga. We call into the **Uneke Lounge for afternoon tea** before meeting our **local guide** for a **highlights tour of Wagga**. Later this afternoon we arrive at our accommodation for a rest before dinner.

Day 2. Sun 02 Oct: Hay - Mildura

Breakfast & Dinner

After breakfast we make our way across to Hay and visit the **Hay Gaol.** Opened in 1880, the state heritage listed Hay Gaol has an intriguing history - over the last century it has operated as a gaol, maternity hospital, a locked hospital for the insane, a prisoner of war detention centre for Japanese and Italian prisoners, an institute for girls and now a museum! After our guided tour we stop by **Robertson's Hot Bread Kitchen** in Hay for a chance to purchase lunch. We continue across to Mildura, enjoying a comfort stop before arriving at our accommodation to check-in and rest before dinner.

Day 3. Mon 03 Oct: Mildura - Mannum - Murray Princess

Breakfast, Lunch & Dinner

This morning after breakfast we depart Mildura and make our way across the **Riverland of South Australia into Renmark**. We call in at the **historic Olivewood Estate** situated on the outskirts of town. A grove of old olive trees and date palms planted in 1890 by Charles Chaffey. Charles was the man behind Olivewood Estate, beginning the story of Renmark's transformation and that of the entire Riverland regions irrigation and settlements. We enjoy morning tea and a guided tour of the Estate before making our way to Blanchetown, home of Lock No.1. Travelling through **Waikerie** we stop to view the unique silo art by two artists, local Garry Duncan and Melbourne artist Jimmy Dvate. Duncan's work features various cartoonish animals on abstract backgrounds, while Dvates' realistic art features a Cherax Destructor aka Yabby, a Murray Hardyhead fish and a beautiful Regent Parrot. We enjoy **lunch at the historic Blanchetown Hotel**, which has been trading on its current site for 117 years and is a gem of pioneer construction, the rafters were shaped with a broad axe! After lunch we continue into the Murray River Port of Mannum, the birthplace of the Murray River trade and communication. Here we board the delightful PS Murray Princess and travel downriver while we enjoy pre-dinner drinks and a welcome dinner. As we cruise under floodlight to our overnight mooring at Mundarra, we may see nocturnal wildlife on the riverbank as well as grey kangaroos, hairy-nosed wombats, Murray long necked turtles spoon-beaked egrets and many other species. Our on-board entertainer provides music for the night owls amongst us!

Day 4. Tue 04 Oct: Murray Princess

Breakfast, Lunch & Dinner

In 1879 the first bridge to span the Murray River was built at **Edwards Crossing**, which quickly became the bustling township of Murray Bridge. After a hearty breakfast, we join a guided tour of the town's historic landmarks and local attractions. This afternoon we begin our journey upriver. Tonight **we moor at Craignook**, where after dinner we are entertained by the talented crew of the Murray Princess.

Day 5. Wed 05 Oct: Murray Princess

Breakfast, Lunch & Dinner

After breakfast, it's all ashore for the **guided nature walk** where our guide will share the secrets of the local flora and fauna. It's a great way to get in a little exercise before Murray Princess departs for the **big river gorges and 90 metre cliffs of the upper river**. Mid-morning, we gather in the Sturt Dining room for a special presentation on the bounty of food and wine produced in the Riverlands. At the 205km mark, we turn and head downriver to River View Lodge, where our discovery vessel awaits for a **backwater wildlife tour**. Travelling in small, personalised groups, we explore the maze of backwaters, creeks and lagoons. The birdlife is amazing. Watch for darters, herons and egrets feeding along the river's muddy edges. Late afternoon, photography enthusiasts have a great opportunity to **capture a spectacular cliff-top river sunset**, before joining the Captain and Officers for pre-dinner drinks and Captain's dinner dance finale.

Day 6. Thu 06 Oct: Murray Princess

Breakfast, Lunch & Dinner

Enjoy breakfast on-board or an **optional** early morning "**Bush Tucker Breakfast**" (additional cost) or a bush walk with the Captain. The vessel then cruises slowly downriver past magnificent cliffs scoured by the river over millions of years. We reach **Ngaut Ngaut Aboriginal Reserve**, one of Australia's most significant archaeological sites, for a step back in time – tens of thousands of years – for a **guided boardwalk** tour to view **ancient rock carvings** and to learn about Aboriginal history in the area. We return to the vessel and cruise downriver to **Younghusband**. Along the way, adventure seekers can also take a speedboat ride. We pass large billabongs, open expanses of water, surrounded by cliffs and reeds. Tonight the Captain and his officers host a spectacular **Farewell Captain's Buffet**. Dress up and dance the night away to celebrate our last night of our wonderful Murray River Cruise.

Day 7. Fri 07 Oct: Murray Princess - Sea Lake

Breakfast, Lunch & Dinner

After breakfast, the **PS Murray Princess arrive in Mannum**, where we reluctantly say farewell to the crew of the Princess and head across through Tailem Bend to **Pinnaroo**. Once in Pinnaroo we enjoy **lunch at the Bakery** before continuing through to Murrayville, Underbool and **Patchewollock**, where we view one of the art silo on the 200km Wimmera Silo Art Trail.

Day 7. Continued

Completed in 2016, Brisbane Artist, Fintan Magee, booked a room at the local pub to immerse himself in the community and get to know its people. When he met local sheep and grain farmer, Nick "Noodle" Hulland, Magee knew he had found his muse. The artist's depiction of the famously reserved Hulland portrays an image of the archetypal Aussie farmer, dressed in his faded blue "flanny" and all. Hulland's solemn expression, sun-bleached hair and squinting gaze speak to the harshness of the environment and the challenges of life in the Wimmera Mallee. We continue into Sea Lake where we check into the **new unique Lake Tyrrell Accommodation**. We are then joined by our **Lake Tyrrell guide Julie** before taking a drive around Sea Lakes unique 'street art' and viewing the new Sea Lake Silo mural which depicts a young girl swinging from a Mallee eucalyptus tree looking over Lake Tyrrell, and a big open sky which gradually fades from dusk to night. Its then out to the Lake Tyrrell platform to view the **spectacular colours of a Lake Tyrrell sunset.** Those wishing are able to hop into their "**Gum Boots**", which are supplied, allowing us to take a walk on the lake. Following we travel back to our accommodation for dinner.

Day 8. Sat 08 Oct: Sea Lake - Silo Art Trail - Stawell

Breakfast, Lunch & Dinner

For those wishing we will be returning to the lake to **capture the colours of sunrise over the lake** before returning for breakfast. Following check out we take a look through the Sky Mirror Gallery which showcases the images of Lake Tyrrell's ever changing colours. We travel across to **Lascelles**, the fifth silo mural to be completed. In order to capture the true essence of Lascelles, Melbourne-based artist, Rone knew that he had to learn about the town from those who were deeply connected to it. Here, he depicts local farming couple Geoff and Merrilyn Horman, part of a family that has lived and farmed in the area for four generations. We enjoy lunch at the Minapre Hotel before continuing down to Rosebery where we view the most recently finished artwork by Kaff-eine. Completed in late 2017, Kaff-eine's artwork depicts themes that she says embody the region's past, present and future. Our next stop, Brim, was the first silo completed. The small farming town captured the world's attention in January 2016 after Brisbane street artist Guido van Helten painted a giant mural on the town's unused grain silos depicting an anonymous, multi-generational quartet of female and male farmers. At Sheep Hills, artist Matt Adnate has created a monster 30m high x 40m wide piece of art dedicated to Aboriginal Wergaia Elder, Uncle Ron Marks, and Wotjobaluk Elder, Aunty Regina Hood, alongside two young children, Savannah Marks and Curtly McDonald which celebrates the richness of the area's Indigenous culture. The **Rupanyup Silo**, created by Russian street artist Julia Volchkova and dedicated to local netball and football players, will be our final of six we will view along the 200km "Wimmera Silo Art" Trail. We continue into Stawell, checking in to our accommodation for a rest before dinner.

Day 9. Sun 09 Oct: Stawell - Albury

Breakfast, Lunch & Dinner

This morning we depart for Albury, calling into **Mitchelton Wines** for lunch in the Muse Restaurant followed by wine and cheese tasting. After a relaxing afternoon we continue into Albury and check in to our accommodation before dinner.

Breakfast

Today after breakfast, we check out and depart for home, enjoying several comfort stops along the way to stretch our legs, as well as a chance to purchase lunch.
